COMMITMENT SUNDAY—NOVEMBER 19TH!

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes so that “like good stewards of the manifold grace of God [we may] serve one another with whatever gift each of [us] has received” (I Peter 4:10).

Our congregation's Stewardship Ministry Team has again reflected on the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. We remember that “the earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it” (Psalm 24:1) as we consider how to steward the gifts of God that we possess. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, “What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?” During morning worship on Commitment Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Commitment Sunday for “God loves a cheerful giver” (2 Cor 9:7). We urge people to attend even if they do not fill out a card that day; the procedure is done in such a way that no one feels any awkwardness if he or she does not fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship Pastor Mark will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship and offering.

We will encourage participation in Commitment Sunday events through the Stewardship Ministry Team and the Leadership Ministry Team. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire and commit everyone to attend Commitment Sunday worship.

Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Commitment Sunday events.

There are so many things at House of Hope to give thanks for; I'm especially thankful this month for the many ways that our congregation especially welcomes children and youth and makes them feel so at home and so included in our church building and congregational life.

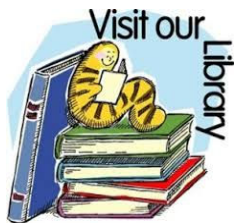

Now about the collection for God's people: Do what I told the Galatian churches to do. On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income, saving it up, so that when I come no collection will have to be made.

I Corinthians 16:1-2

In this passage, Paul discusses one of his passions, giving by the churches to spread the Good News and to care for the poor. In particular, he directs the Corinthians to give regularly (on the first day of every week) and in proportion to each person’s prosperity.

Giving systematically is the key to faithful giving.

- If we set up a system whereby we give regularly, our giving is not affected by our mood. We don’t just give when we feel like it or when we’ve heard a dramatic appeal for money. We give when the time comes, as we have set it up.
- Some people find it difficult to give away their hard-earned money. Their money is a part of them and they go through a grieving process when they part with it. By setting up regular giving, you make a “painful” decision once a year, instead of every time you decide to give.
- Regularity can also save us from self-deception. If we give nothing for a time, then give a sizable gift in response to a heartstring appeal, we may deceive ourselves into believing that we are very generous. If, in fact, the amount of that gift was spread over a year, we may find that it is really not so generous.

Father, you are the most generous giver of all. Your giving isn't sporadic or hit-and-miss; you bless me all the time. Teach me to give as you give, with an open heart and open hands. Amen.
